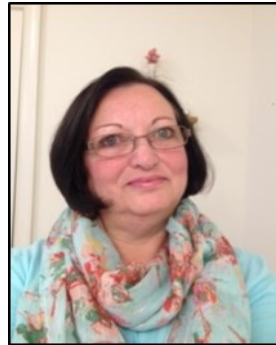

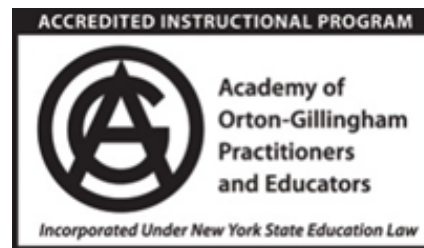

Orton-Gillingham Approach

Orton-Gillingham is an instructional approach intended primarily for use with persons who have difficulty with reading, spelling, and writing often associated with dyslexia. It is practiced as an approach, not a method, system, or technique. The Orton-Gillingham approach is frequently associated with 1:1 teacher-student instruction model and is often a valuable part of small group instruction. It focuses on the learning needs of the individual student since students with dyslexia need to master basic knowledge about language in order to become competent readers and writers.

This course offers the required coursework approved by the Academy of Orton-Gillingham Practitioners and Educators.

This training program educates interested individuals in the Orton-Gillingham Approach. Space is limited to 15 participants on a first come, first serve basis.

Two week Associate Level 1 Course

Daily 8:00 am – 4:00 pm

Monday, July 10 - Friday, July 14, 2017

Monday, July 24 - Friday, July 28, 2017

Completion of the 70 hours of coursework meets Academy requirements for Part 1 of Associate Level training.

Registration Fee: \$1,200.00

The course will cover the following topics:

- √ dyslexia and reading disorders
- √ the rationale of the Orton-Gillingham approach
- √ phonology and morphology
- √ the motor component and the writing process
- √ vocabulary, reading comprehension, and fluency
- √ assessment and diagnostic-prescriptive teaching
- √ the student profile, lesson plan, and teaching materials
- √ The Academy structure and requirements

Note: In order to fulfill the requirements set forth by the Academy, a practicum is required consisting of a minimum 100 hours of tutoring one-to-one with sessions lasting forty to sixty minutes at least twice a week over the course of an academic year or a minimum of 8 months. This can be arranged after the coursework is completed by the instructor. There is an additional fee of \$1500 for this supervised practicum. Certified Part 2 Course

Daily 8:00 am - 5:00 pm

This 50 hour course will be over six days plus two extra hours of homework.

- √ intermediate O-G elements
- √ designing and selecting appropriate materials
- √ advanced grammar concepts
- √ paragraph development
- √ expository writing
- √ assistive technology
- √ student profiles and the next step
